

## **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

### **LOUDON CITY COUNCIL**

**November 16, 2015**

Public hearings were held before the Loudon City Council on November 16, 2015 in the Council Meeting Room. Those present for all of the public hearings were: Mayor Jim Greenway, Councilmen Jeff Harris, Lynn Millsaps and Dennis Stewart. Also present were City Manager Lynn Mills, City Recorder Stephanie Putkonen and City Attorney Joe Ford. Councilman Johnny James was present for the second and third hearings. There were three people present for the first public hearing, five people present for the second public hearing and eight for the third public hearing. The press was not represented.

#### **REGULATING PARKING ON CERTAIN HIGHWAY 72 NORTH FRONTAGE ROAD**

Mayor Greenway called the public hearing to order at 6:15 P.M. Manager Mills explained that the ordinance would limit parking to 30 minutes on the frontage road in front of the shopping center containing Food City. He said there was a problem with truck drivers leaving their trailers there for up to a week.

There being no other comments or questions, Mayor Greenway closed the public hearing at 6:20 P.M.

#### **AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 5, CHAPTER 5 TO ESTABLISH PURCHASING AND BIDDING PROCEDURES**

Mayor Greenway called the public hearing to order at 6:20 P.M. Manager Mills said the ordinance was based on current state law and it would update if the state makes changes in the future. It also increases purchasing limits without bidding from \$5,000 to \$10,000.

Mayor Greenway called for more comments or questions regarding the ordinance. There being none, he closed the public hearing at 6:21 P.M.

#### **AMENDING THE 2015-2016 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET**

Mayor Greenway called the public hearing to order at 6:25 P.M. Manager Mills said the budget amendments provide the funding for the purchase of the property on Main Street from Family Pride Corporation (Dover Development Corporation) as well as increasing the budget for building rehabilitation grants and reducing the amount for residential grants in the Courthouses Square Revitalization Fund.

Mayor Greenway called for more comments or questions regarding the ordinance. There being none, he closed the public hearing at 6:26 P.M.
